

In addition to our Cambridge programs, we offer the Towards Independence program at our Umalas campus, which draws from the ASDAN curriculum to support students who benefit from a more personalized learning approach. This program blends academic learning outcomes with life skills development, using structured modules to build awareness of healthy routines, community involvement, and environmental responsibility. Students also have opportunities to engage in vocational experiences through partnerships with supportive work environments across Bali, helping them develop confidence, independence, and a sense of purpose both within and beyond the classroom. We also provide in-school support through a dedicated team of professionals, including occupational therapists and speech and language therapists, who work alongside teachers to address individual learning goals, motor development, and communication skills within a nurturing and structured environment.

Tailored Support and Collaborative Services for Student Success

We offer tailored educational support through our Inclusive Education Coordinator and a dedicated team of professionals, including occupational therapists, speech and language therapists, school counselors, and EAL (English as an Additional Language) specialists. This collaborative team works closely with classroom teachers to support students in achieving individual learning goals, enhancing communication and motor development, and promoting emotional well-being. Our inclusive approach ensures that every student can thrive within a nurturing and structured learning environment.

Assessment and Academic Progress

At ProEd Global School, assessment is an essential part of our teaching and learning approach, allowing us to monitor progress, personalise instruction, and ensure students meet key academic benchmarks.

We implement a range of assessments across year levels:

- MAP Growth Assessments: Conducted twice yearly, these adaptive, international-standard tests in reading, language usage, and mathematics provide detailed insights into each student's learning growth, helping teachers target instruction effectively.
- Cambridge Progression Tests and Checkpoint Assessments: Used in Primary and Lower Secondary, these assessments measure student progress in core subjects such as English, Mathematics, and Science. They ensure readiness for the next stage of learning and allow us to benchmark performance against international standards.
- IGCSE and AS/A Level Examinations: In our secondary program, students sit for official Cambridge examinations, which are globally recognised and provide pathways into top universities and career opportunities.
- National Assessments: For students following the Indonesian National Curriculum, we also prepare and support them for required national examinations, ensuring compliance and competency in line with Ministry of Education standards.

Real World Experiences (Toward Independence Students Only)

ProEd Global School offers Towards Independence (TI4) students hands-on training with local businesses and ProEd family connections. SEN staff support students on-site, gradually transitioning responsibility to site managers. This program builds essential skills, preparing students for adulthood and future careers.

Foodwise (Culinary Training for Toward Independence Students Only) Secondary and TI3 students develop essential life skills through weekly culinary classes. They learn food preparation, cooking techniques, and teamwork while practicing math, reading, communication, and problem-solving. These lessons promote independence and real-world skills for daily living.

Nursery (Ages 3-4)

At ProEd Global School, our Nursery Class provides a warm, stimulating environment where children aged 3–4 begin their educational journey through joyful, play-based learning. Rooted in the Cambridge Early Years framework, our curriculum nurtures early development across all domains—cognitive, physical, emotional, and social—while preparing children for a smooth transition into Reception.

Our Learning Approach

We believe that children learn best through active, hands-on experiences. Our Nursery curriculum focuses on:

Sensory Exploration

Children are encouraged to explore textures, sounds, smells, and movement to develop sensory awareness, motor skills, and curiosity. Activities include sensory bins, nature walks, sand and water play, and tactile materials.

Creative Play

Through imaginative play and open-ended activities, children build language, social skills, and self-expression. Daily opportunities for dress-up, storytelling, construction, and role-play promote confidence and collaboration.

Practical Life Skills

Children are guided in activities like pouring, sorting, dressing, and tidying uppromoting independence, coordination, and confidence in everyday routines.

Core Learning Areas

Our academic foundation supports early understanding of English, Math, and Science in age-appropriate, engaging ways:

Early English Language Skills

- Vocabulary development through stories, songs, and interactive read-alouds
- Phonological awareness (listening to sounds, rhymes, and syllables)
- Early mark-making and letter recognition
- Speaking and listening activities to develop communication

Foundations of Mathematics

- Exploring numbers through songs, movement, and counting games
- Learning about shapes, sizes, patterns, and measurement through manipulatives

- Discovery-based activities that explore nature, weather, animals, and the senses
- Simple experiments and observations to build inquiry and curiosity
- Nature walks and themed exploration weeks

Enrichment Areas

In addition to our academic and developmental focus, our Nursery students enjoy a variety of co-curricular experiences:

- **Physical Education (PE):** Daily movement activities to build coordination, balance, and gross motor skills through games, obstacle courses, and outdoor play.
- **Music & Movement:** Rhythmic activities, singing, and instruments support musical awareness, memory, and joy in self-expression.
- Arts & Crafts: Guided and free-choice art using various materials helps children explore colors, textures, and creativity while strengthening fine motor control.

A Safe and Supportive Environment

Our classrooms are calm, colourful, and developmentally designed to promote exploration and comfort. We ensure each child receives individual attention, guidance, and support.

Pathway to Reception

The Nursery Class is the first step in our Early Years pathway. With exposure to Cambridge-aligned activities and resources, children are gradually introduced to routines and skills that will prepare them for the Reception Year and beyond.



Reception

At ProEd Global School, our Reception class welcomes children into a nurturing, fun, and engaging environment where a lifelong love of learning begins. Guided by the Cambridge Early Years Curriculum, we create a warm and inclusive setting tailored to the developmental needs of our youngest learners. Every child is seen, supported, and celebrated. Through sensory integration, purposeful play, and hands-on learning experiences, we help children build confidence, independence, and foundational skills that will last a lifetime.

Learning Through Inquiry and Imagination

Our teachers use an inquiry-based approach that encourages children to explore, ask questions, and express their ideas. This child-centered method fosters curiosity, creativity, and critical thinking from the very start. Whether we're building with blocks, investigating the world around us, or diving into imaginative stories, every experience is thoughtfully designed to make learning joyful, meaningful, and developmentally appropriate.

A Balanced and Engaging Curriculum

Our Reception Class program is designed to support growth across key areas of development:

- Mathematics
- Physical development
- Emotional and social development
- Literacy, Communication and Language
- Phonics awareness
- · Understanding the world
- Expressive arts, music and design

We teach these subjects through themed units, such as dinosaurs, space, jungles, and the seaside, using a combination of teacher-led lessons and student-led discovery.

Primary (Year 1 - Year 6)

At ProEd Global School, our Primary programme follows the Cambridge Primary Curriculum, focusing on strong academic foundations and whole-child development. We provide a nurturing, engaging environment where students build confidence, global awareness, and a love of learning through exploration and hands-on experiences.

Teaching Approach

Guided by Cambridge learner attributes, our inquiry-based, student-centered approach encourages curiosity, collaboration, and critical thinking. Classrooms support diverse learning styles through creative and differentiated instruction.

Curriculum Highlights

- English: Phonics, interactive reading, and writing linked to real-life contexts.
- Mathematics: Hands-on learning with the CPA model, emphasizing problem-solving and mastery.
- Science: Inquiry-based exploration, simple experiments, and observation of the natural world

Cross-Curricular Learning

Integrated themes link subjects like global perspectives, geography, literacy, and the arts—developing key skills such as teamwork, communication, and critical thinking.

Upper Secondary (Year 10-13)

At ProEd Global School Umalas, our Upper Secondary Program is designed to provide students with a broad, balanced, and academically rigorous education that prepares them for further studies and future career pathways. We offer internationally recognized qualifications through the **Cambridge IGCSE** and **Cambridge International AS & A Leve**l programs, as well as the **BTEC Pearson** curriculum for students seeking a more practical and career-focused approach.

Cambridge IGCSE Program

The International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) is typically undertaken by students in Year 10 and 11. Students who complete IGCSE typically continue on with AS Level courses in year 12. At ProEd Global School Umalas, we offer the following IGCSE subjects:

In addition to the above IGCSE subjects, students in **years 10 and 11** also have to take elective classes, such as

Our IGCSE curriculum emphasizes both academic knowledge and the development of essential skills such as critical thinking, problem-solving, research, and effective communication.





Cambridge International AS & A Level Program

Our AS & A Level program is typically pursued in **Year 12 and 13** and offers students the opportunity to specialize in subjects aligned with their university and career aspirations. These qualifications are globally recognized and highly valued by higher education institutions.

Note: In year 12 (AS Level) students are required to take 4 of the 7 subjects options. In year 13 (A Level) students drop one subject to take 3 subjects.

In addition to the Cambridge curriculum, students in the AS & A Level program are required to study Bahasa Indonesia/Pendidikan Pancasila to comply with the **Indonesian national education regulations**. These subjects ensure that students develop an understanding of national identity, values, and civic responsibility.

The following table outlines the subjects and the required instructional hours per week:

BTEC Pearson Curriculum

BTEC qualifications are career-focused and project-based, providing students with real-world skills and hands-on experience that prepare them for direct entry into real-world experiences.

This program is underpinned by the ASDAN curriculum and designed to support diverse learning profiles through a highly personalised, engaging, and inclusive approach.

A Supportive and Individualised Learning Environment

Our classrooms are designed to be flexible and inclusive, allowing students to engage with the curriculum in ways that meet their unique needs. With small class sizes and high teacher-to-student ratios, we ensure each child receives individualised attention. Students follow personalised learning plans that include academic, social, and functional goals, which are reviewed each term to track progress and provide targeted support.

Curriculum and Pathways

Students in the *Towards Independence Program* follow ASDAN's accredited learning framework, which includes a combination of academic content and life skills modules. In the primary years (TII & TI2), students aged 5–12 engage with the New Horizons, Life Skills Challenges, and Starting Out programs. These modules focus on early academic foundations, communication, and the development of routines and community awareness.

In the secondary years (TI3 & TI4), students aged 12–18 continue with ASDAN's Towards Independence modules and select from a range of Short Courses tailored to their interests and abilities. Academic learning is supported through structured lessons in literacy, numeracy, and communication, complemented by inclusive experiences in subjects such as Art and Sport & Fitness.



CURRICULUM OVERVIEW FOR TOWARD INDEPENDENCE PROGRAM

Inclusion and Community Integration

Students benefit from meaningful inclusion in whole-school activities such as playground time, assemblies, and specialist classes, which foster social interaction, communication, and a sense of belonging. Lessons are supported by a multidisciplinary team, including our Speech and Language Therapists and Occupational Therapists, who work collaboratively to meet individual learning and developmental needs.

Practical Skills and Real World Training

As students progress through the program, they participate in community-based learning and real world experiences that prepare them for life beyond school. Older learners engage in structured training at local venues, developing practical skills in areas such as barista work, kitchen training, and childcare. These experiences are guided by our support team to ensure students build confidence, communication, and independence in real-world settings.

Building Skills for Life

Our goal is to equip students with the tools they need to thrive in everyday life. Through tailored ASDAN modules, students develop essential life competencies including:

- Financial literacy Understanding money and responsible spending
- Time management Learning to organise tasks and routines
- Self-reliance Making independent choices and daily decisions
- Communication Expressing needs and interacting with others
- Independent living Navigating the home and community confidently
- Catering Preparing food and understanding kitchen safety
- Physical fitness Engaging in regular sports and movement

At ProEd, the *Towards Independence Program* is more than a curriculum—it's a commitment to helping each learner grow in confidence, purpose, and independence as they prepare for their next steps in life.

Towards Independence 1 (5 to 7 years old)

In the Towards Independence I (TII) class, students aged 5 to 7 develop essential life skills in a supportive environment that promotes inclusion and confidence. This class helps them gradually participate in mainstream activities, fostering independence and a sense of belonging.

Key Life Skills Taught:

- Personal Hygiene: Washing hands, brushing teeth, and using the toilet independently.
- Dressing Themselves: Managing zippers, buttons, shoelaces, and keeping clean.
- Basic Cooking: Simple tasks like spreading butter, pouring cereal, and mixing ingredients.
- Cleaning Up: Tidying toys, work areas, and helping with classroom chores.
- Following Instructions: Practicing routines and preparing for tasks.
- Social Skills: Sharing, taking turns, and expressing feelings.
- Problem-Solving: Finding solutions to everyday challenges.
- Basic Safety: Crossing streets safely and handling emergencies.
- Money Management: Counting coins and understanding basic spending.
- Time Management: Learning routines and the importance of punctuality.

Inclusion classes foster social integration, while work experience opportunities inside and outside school help students transition smoothly into the workforce.

ProEd follows the principle of a **Least Restrictive Environment (LRE)**, ensuring students learn in a setting that maximizes their independence and success. An **IEP** team reviews each student's strengths, needs, and potential benefits of different placements to create an optimal learning environment.

IEP meetings are held annually, bringing together parents, teachers, service providers, administrators, and sometimes the student. Progress is reviewed each term, with new goals set as needed. At the start of each school year, IEP meetings outline necessary accommodations and modifications to support student success.

Integration of Specialists service

We believe every child deserves access to quality learning in a supportive environment tailored to their needs.



The Waves of Intervention

The Waves of Intervention model is a framework commonly used in educational settings to conceptualize the levels of support provided to students based on their needs. It typically consists of three main waves, each representing a different level of intervention intensity. This is in continued practice of the least restrictive environment when choosing placement for our students in maximizing their potential. Below is an overview of the wave levels:



At ProEd, we support students at different levels based on their needs:

- **Universal (Wave 1):** Support for all students to create a positive learning environment. This includes school-wide programs like social-emotional learning, character education, and positive behavior strategies.
- **Targeted (Wave 2):** Extra help for students who need additional support. This may involve small group sessions, tutoring, counseling, or behavior support plans for a set period.
- Intensive (Wave 3): Specialized support for students with significant academic, behavioral, or emotional challenges. These students have an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) and receive individualized instruction, counseling, and external support if needed.

This tiered approach ensures every student gets the right level of support to succeed.

OUR TEAM

Occupational Therapist (OT)

OT helps students develop essential life skills for school, home, and daily activities.

How OT Supports Students at ProEd:

- Sensory Support: Helps manage sensitivities to noise, light, and touch.
- Fine Motor Skills: Improves writing, cutting, and handling objects.
- Gross Motor Skills: Builds balance, coordination, and movement.
- Daily Life Skills: Supports independence in dressing, eating, and hygiene.
- Organization & Planning: Teaches time management and problem-solving.
- Visual Skills: Helps with reading, writing, and spatial awareness.
- Classroom Adaptations: Adjusts tools and seating for better learning.
- Transition Support: Prepares students for school changes and future jobs.

Speech Therapist

Rationale

This policy provides a structured framework that outlines the financial obligations of students and their families toward ProEd Global School.

Purpose

The primary aim of this policy is to establish a fair, transparent, and sustainable financial framework that supports the educational mission, vision, and operational needs of ProEd Global School while promoting accessibility and inclusivity,

Guidelines

This policy details the various conditions and requirements applicable at ProEd Global School. Types of Fees All fees are listed in **Indonesian Rupiah (IDR)**. Any adjustments will be communicated to parents/guardians in advance.

Enrolment Fee

A one-time, non-refundable fee of **IDR 10,500,000** is payable when a place for a student is offered and accepted.

Re-enrolment Fee

A one-time, non-refundable fee of **IDR 10,500,000** is required upon acceptance of an offer of placement for a student.

Placement Deposit

A one-time fee equal to **10%** of the total school fees is required when a class is at capacity and a student is placed on the waiting list. If the student is subsequently offered a place, this Placement Deposit will be deducted from the total school fees.

Tuition Fees

Tuition fees cover the core academic programme and the delivery of the school's curriculum by qualified teachers. This includes access to classroom instruction, assessments, academic reporting, and a range of co-curricular and enrichment activities that support students' learning and development. Tuition fees are essential for maintaining high educational standards, investing in quality teaching staff, and providing a supportive and engaging learning environment for all students.

Levies

1. Development Levy

An annual, non-refundable Development Levy is payable in advance, as follows:

- IDR 12,500,000 for students in Nursery, Reception, Years 1 to 6, and Towards Independence 1 and 2
- **IDR 15,000,000** for students in Years 7 to 13 and Towards Independence 3 For students enrolling after Term 1, the levy will be applied on a pro-rata basis, calculated

by term.

The Development Levy contributes to the operational costs of ProEd Global School, including campus facilities and land lease expenses.

2. Materials and Resources Levy

A non-refundable fee of IDR 14,500,000 is payable annually in advance.

For students enrolling after Term 1, this fee will be charged on a pro-rata (term-based) basis. This fee covers the cost of essential learning materials, classroom resources, and educational tools provided throughout the academic year. It includes items such as workbooks, stationery, art supplies, printed materials, digital learning platforms, science lab consumables, and other resources used to support daily teaching and learning activities.

The fee ensures that students have consistent access to high-quality materials without the need for individual purchases during the school year.

3. Pastoral Care Levy

An annual, non-refundable Pastoral Care Levy of **IDR 5,000,000** is payable in advance. For students enrolling after Term 1, the fee will be applied on a pro-rata basis, calculated by term.

This levy supports the school's commitment to student well-being, helping to fund programs and services such as counselling, mentoring, character education, well-being workshops, and community-building initiatives. It ensures that every student has access to the guidance and support needed to thrive in a safe, inclusive, and nurturing environment. Please note that this fee applies exclusively to the Umalas campus.

Individualised Education Programme (IEP) Fee

A non-refundable fee of **IDR 25,000,000** is payable annually for students requiring customised learning plans.

Integration Aid Fee

A non-refundable annual fee of **IDR 100,000,000** is payable for students requiring a 1:1 Teacher Assistant.

English as an Additional Language (EAL) Fee

A non-refundable termly fee of **IDR 5,000,000** is payable on a termly basis for students requiring English language development support.

Camp and Excursions Fee

This fee covers the costs associated with student camps, field trips, and educational excursions organised throughout the academic year. It includes expenses such as transportation, accommodation, meals, entry fees, activity materials, and supervision. These experiences are designed to enhance classroom learning, foster personal growth, and encourage teamwork, independence, and real-world understanding.

Attendance at camps for Year 7 and above is compulsory. If a student is unable to participate due to personal, social, emotional, or physical reasons, this must be discussed directly with the Head of School. Please note that camps incur an additional cost for families, and students may attend one camp per academic year.

Students also take part in regular excursions, usually once each term. To keep these experiences accessible for all families, the school strives to limit the cost of each day trip to no more than **IDR 450,000**.

Bus Service Fee

This fee covers the cost of providing safe and reliable transportation for students between their homes and the school. It includes expenses related to fuel, vehicle maintenance, insurance, and the employment of trained drivers and bus attendants. The Bus Service Fee ensures a convenient and secure commuting option for families, with routes and schedules designed to accommodate the needs of the school community.

- 1. Families are encouraged to make an upfront yearly payment to enable the continuous planning and development of our programme to the highest standard.
- 2. All invoices must be paid in advance for students to receive educational support unless alternative arrangements have been made with the Head of School.
- 3. Parents/guardians must adhere to the specified payment deadlines to avoid penalties

Monthly Payment

- 1. Parents/guardians may apply for a monthly payment plan if they can provide written evidence that:
- The family has experienced a loss of more than 40% of their monthly income for a consistent period of five (5) months or more, or
- The family's primary earner has been unemployed for five (5) months or more.
- 2. The monthly payment plan incurs a one-time surcharge of IDR 10,000,000, which is added to the current annual fees. Additionally, all levies must be paid in the first instalment.
- 3. While school fees are paid monthly, the total annual tuition fee is divided across the first three terms of the academic year. This means that payments during Terms 1, 2, and 3 will be higher, with no standard tuition payments required in Term 4.

- 4. Parents/guardians on a monthly plan must continue payments up to and including the term in which they choose to withdraw from the school.
- 5. If a parent/guardian defaults on a payment or demonstrates inconsistency, the student may be withdrawn from the school by the Head of School or Director.
- 6. The monthly payments are not eligible for any discounts, except for the sibling discount.

- 4. A copy of the transfer slip, including the invoice number and student name(s), should be submitted to the Finance Team upon completion of the transaction.

Late Payment Policy

- A late payment fee of **2%** per month will be charged on any payments not received by the due date.
- Failure to pay tuition fees within the grace period may result in a temporary suspension of the student from school activities.
- Continued non-payment may lead to cancellation of enrolment and, if necessary, legal action.

Refund Policy

- 1. Enrolment, Levies, and Integration Aid fees are strictly non-refundable.
- 2. Tuition fee refunds will only be considered in exceptional cases and must be requested in writing.
- 3.Refund eligibility and amounts will be determined based on the school's refund guidelines and the timing of the withdrawal request.
- 4. Students in serious breach of ProEd Global School policies may be removed from the course without a refund.

Discount

- 1.A **5%** discount is offered on tuition fees when the full annual payment is made in advance.
- 2. Families enrolling a second child are eligible for a **5%** discount on that child's tuition fees.
- 3.A **10%** discount is available exclusively at the Nuanu Campus for families who are part of the Nuanu Community. To qualify, parents or guardians must provide proof of employment with a Nuanu Community Member.

Withdrawal and Transfer Policy

- 1. Parents/guardians must provide written notice at least one term in advance if they intend to withdraw or transfer their child.
- 2. Failure to provide timely notice may result in additional financial obligations.
- 3. All outstanding payments must be settled before the withdrawal or transfer process is finalised.

Dispute Resolution

Any disputes or disagreements regarding payments or financial matters will first be addressed through direct communication between the persons responsible for fee payments and the School's Business Manager. 
