# CLASS BEYOND THE CAMPUS

## A STRONG COMMUNITY

Since we opened the doors of Nuanu campus in August 2023, our community has gone from strength to strength. From a core group of 60 students then to more than triple that in less than two years, many of our original families are still with us.

Our parent community is something that we are very proud of, and we have a great parent volunteer group called the PNFC (ProEd Nuanu Family Community) but also known as the ProEd Nuanu Fun Club!

The PNFC bring added value to our community by hosting several events each term - usually one student focused event, one community focused event and one parent only event. Events are held on or off campus. We welcome new PNFC members to help build our wonderful Nuanu community.



## HOW WE LEARN

At ProEd Global School we prioritise individualised learning, recognising each student's unique pace, strengths, and challenges.

Our teaching staff come from 15+ countries bringing a wealth of experience and skills, providing tailored support.

Our dedicated EAL (English as Additional Language) programme helps students who are not native English speakers master English and transition smoothly into our curriculum.

# EARLY YEARS CURRICULUM

Our youngest learners in Nursery class are offered a curriculum that leads up to the Reception level. This curriculum is designed to be taught through art, play, songs and stories. The Curriculum includes:

**Communication Language and Literacy** (English — developing phonological awareness and identifying words and syllables in spoken words)

**Creative expression** (Art and Design; Music; Dance and Drama — as part of the Play/Songs and Stories in our timetable)

**Mathematics** (Giving the students a sense of numbers through counting during nature walks, during play, even during snack time! Exploring shapes, space and measure)

**Personal, Social and Emotional Development** (an important aspect that helps children identify their feelings, learn boundaries, develop self-regulation and maintain health and self care!)



At Nuano, our **Reception** class offers a fun, nurturing, and hands-on learning environment for our second youngest students. With small class sizes and caring teachers, we create a warm space where children can grow through play, sensory activities, and exploration.

Using an inquiry-based approach, our teachers encourage students to ask questions, share ideas, and take an active role in their learning. With patience and creativity, they support each child's growth and help spark a lifelong love of learning.

We follow the **Cambridge Early Years programme**, which takes a holistic approach to child development and prepares students for the next stage in their education. The programme focuses on six key areas:

- Communication, Language and Literacy
- Mathematics
- Creative Expression
- Physical Development
- Personal, Social and Emotional Development
- Understanding the World



# PRIMARY CURRICULUM

Learning is an inquiry-based experience! This education programme is designed for children aged 5 to 11, with small-sized classes and a high teacher-to-student ratio to ensure each child receives individual attention.

We use multiple teaching approaches that go beyond just speaking and writing to engage children in learning.

**All ProEd students follow the internationally-recognised Cambridge curriculum. Primary students receive a rich, balanced programme of core academic subjects alongside specialist enrichment activities, guided by experienced and caring teachers dedicated to nurturing every child's potential.**

Homework is given to all students in Primary school. It is generally issued on a Monday and should be handed in on a Friday.

No homework is issued in the first and last week of each term.



# LOWER SECONDARY CURRICULUM

Our Secondary programme develops critical thinking, independent study, and academic ambition.

By following Cambridge Lower Secondary programme, students are provided with a broad and balanced education, helping them to thrive throughout their schooling, work, and life.

From Year 7, students are taught by subject specialists.

With ten subjects, including **English**, **Mathematics**, and **Science**, students will be exposed to plenty of opportunities to develop creativity, expression, and well-being in a variety of ways. Our students also engage in many school-wide activities beyond the classroom that enrich their learning experience.

# UPPER SECONDARY CURRICULUM

Students aged 15 - 16 will be in Years 10 and 11 respectively. Our core subjects are the subjects that our Year 11 students will be gaining a qualification in.

The IGCSE examinations play a big part in determining what grade a student can achieve. However, depending on which pathway a student is on, they will most likely need to complete coursework or various internal assessments.

Whether they are studying IGCSE or ASDAN courses, our curriculum content starts in Year 10 and is taught over a two-year period. In both Mathematics and Science IGCSE courses, students are either entered into the 'Core' or the 'Extended' exam sessions. Students taking 'Core' Mathematics or Science will have a different exam paper and the highest grade they can achieve is capped at a 'C' grade; students taking 'Extended' will be able to achieve up to an A\* grade.

Each of these subjects is taught over 3–4 hours per week:

- Art & Design or Bahasa Indonesia
- Business Studies
- First Language English (or EAL)
- Global Perspectives
- Information and Communication Technology
- Mathematics (Core or Extended)
- Coordinated Sciences — Double Award (Core or Extended)

## Additional Non-Cambridge Subjects

In addition to the core subjects, students also take the following courses over the course of a week. Each of these subjects will be taught/ led for approximately an hour a week.

- Music or Physical Education
- DEAR / Study Hall



# OUR SPORTS PROGRAMME

## **Nursery & Reception**

The lessons for our youngest students will mostly be focused on improving fine motor skills and spatial awareness through fun games, mini obstacles courses and dance, etc. Skills taught might include: jumping, balancing, throwing, catching and mobility exercises.

## **Years 1-4**

These year groups will start to participate in team sports, slowly scaffolding the skills they've learnt in previous years. There will be an emphasis on teamwork and collaborative spirit. Students will start to explore familiar sports such as football, badminton, dodgeball and running. They will also be exposed to new sports, such as ultimate frisbee, pickle ball, touch rugby and cricket.

## **Years 5-6**

The curriculum for these year groups will be heavily linked to the BSSA (Bali Schools Sports Association) schedule, with the primary aim of getting our students ready to compete against other schools in Bali.

The schedule follows the following format:

- Term 1: Football
- Term 2: Volleyball
- Term 3: Basketball
- Term 4: Cross country

## **Years 7-11**

These year groups will be expanding on skills that were scaffolded in primary, while also exposing students to more physically demanding challenges in terms of strength, resistance, endurance and mobility.

The Secondary sports curriculum is also heavily linked to the BSSA schedule, with the primary aim of getting our students ready to compete against other schools in Bali.

The schedule follows the same format as Year 5-6.



# DUKE OF EDINBURGH AWARD

This long running award impels students aged 13+ to participate in value forming activities. The Award has 3 stages: Bronze level, Silver Level and Gold!

The award facilitates:

- The development of practical and social skills and personal interests

# ADMISSIONS POLICY SUMMARY

Full admissions policy is available on our website

The Admissions Policy for ProEd Global School Nuanu outlines the application process, ensuring clear, fair, and timely admissions while balancing accessibility and safeguarding student outcomes, staff wellbeing, teaching quality, and programme integrity.

Enquiries and school tours are managed efficiently, with tours allowing families to observe classes and learning environments. After tours, families must complete the Admissions Form and submit necessary documentation.

Non-native English speakers undergo an English language readiness review, which aids in placement decisions.

Students **must participate in a trial period** to assess readiness for enrolment. Feedback from this trial informs admissions decisions, which are made by Academic Leadership based on various factors, including academic records and social readiness. A student may be enrolled without a trial during a holiday period, but the first week of attendance is considered the trial, and a place may still be refused and a refund provided.

The school reserves the right to defer or decline applications if needs exceed available support. Offers are typically made within 24-48 hours, and families must pay fees before enrolment. Siblings of current students receive enrolment priority , and a waiting list policy is in place for full classes.

Overseas applicants must complete interviews and documentation before final acceptance. The final admissions decision rests with the Deputy Head of School, who considers the educational needs of the student and the school community.
